









UPUC FACTS AND VITAL STATISTICS

Undergraduate¹ students: 960

- 87 percent are from south central and southeastern Indiana
- 76 percent are full-time students; 24 percent are part-time students
- 69 percent are women; 31 percent are men
 - 27 percent are age 20 or younger; 46 percent are age 21 to 24;
 27 percent are age 25 or older
- Estimated 80 percent work while earning their degree

Graduate¹ students: 91

- 8 percent are international students
- 69 percent are women; 31 percent are men
 - 22 percent are age 24 or younger; 78 percent are age 25 or older
- 25 percent are full-time students; 75 percent are part-time students
 - Most are professionals working full-time concurrently with taking classes

Benefits of an IUPUC education

Economic Impact⁴

- IUPUC total annual impact: \$56.4 million or 926 jobs supported.
- Students will see a \$5.10 return for every dollar invested in IUPUC.
- Taxpayers will receive \$1.90 for every dollar they invest in IUPUC.
- People of Indiana will see a \$13.00 return for every dollar invested in IUPUC.
