Area I English Composition & Speech Communication

Two courses in English composition of at least 3 credits each and 3 credits of speech are required. Students may choose either ENG-W 270 or ENG-W 231. A grade of C (2.0) or better must be obtained in both composition courses (a C- does not count).

Area II Foreign Language

Bachelor of Science Degree: No foreign language required.

Bachelor of Arts Degree: First year proficiency in a foreign language is required. This requirement may be met by (1) completing a first year sequence (8-10 credit hours) in a single language with a passing grade; (2) completing a second-year or third-year course with a grade of C or higher; or (3) taking a placement test and placing into the 200 level or higher. American Sign Language (ASL) may be taken to meet this requirement.

Area IV Physical and Biological Sciences

Please see course overlap list for certain **BIOL and CHEM** courses. **Students must obtain grades of C- or higher in Area IV courses; a grade of D+ or D will be allowed for one course only.** These courses **cannot** be used to fulfill this requirement: BIOL N100, N200, CHEM C100, GEOL G130, PHYS 10000, 20000; all agriculture courses.

Choose from: Astronomy, Biology, Chemistry, Geology, and Physics. **For Bachelor of Science students, 2 of the 4 courses must be biology and/or chemistry courses.**

Area V Mathematics and Computer Science

One course of at least 3 credit hours in mathematics is required for the Bachelor of Arts Degree. MATH 110/111 will be counted in the general electives. At least two courses beyond algebra and trigonometry, totaling a minimum of 6 credit hours, are required for the Bachelor of Science Degree. One course in computer science is required for each degree. **Students must obtain grades of C- or higher in their Area IIID courses; a grade of D+ or D will be allowed for one course only.**
